RIDERS AT A GLANCE:

The 'Riders play the second game of their current four game set against Corpus Christi Friday night. The 'Riders can clinch at least a split of the series tonight after winning the opener 4-2. Following an off day Monday, Frisco will go on the road for seven games.

Friday Night Lights

The RoughRiders are undefeated on Friday games played at Dr Pepper Ballpark with a record of 7-0. Frisco is 9-2 overall on games played on Friday.

Trifecta

Friday night Micah Furtado is looking to do something no 'Rider has done this season. Furtado, who has gone 3-for-4 each of his past two games, is looking to become the first player to have three hits in three consecutive games. Last night Furtado became only the second player to have three hits in back-to-back games, the other being Salomon Manriquez who accomplished this feat earlier this week going 3-for-4 on 7/22-23.

Triple Play

With his 2-for-4 performance including two triples last night, Brandon Boggs became the first RoughRider to hit two triples in a game. With Boggs' accomplishment, the 'Riders are now in second place with Wichita for most triples in the league and just one behind league leading Midland who has 23. For the season, Boggs has three triples, good for second on the team behind Casey Benjamin who is fourth in the league with five.

Extra Bases

With Frisco's four extra base hits last night, it raised their team total to 339. The 'Riders have 938 total hits giving them an extra base percentage of 36%. Their percentage ties them with Midland for the highest percentage of total hits going for extra bases. On the season, the 'Riders lead the league with a .449 slugging percentage.

Power Pitcher

Armando Galarraga received the no decision last night after going 5.0 innings allowing just one run on six hits. For Galarraga it was the third straight start he has given up just one run or less, while going at least five innings. He struck out four, accumulating his lowest total since June 16, when he also fanned four, a period that spans six starts. Galarraga leads the league in strikeouts with 98.

Don't Stop Relieving.

Scott Shoemaker made his first relief appearance in almost a month Thursday. Shoemaker went three innings allowing just one run on three hits. It marked the first time in his last four appearances he has given up one run or fewer and the first in his last five he has surrendered just three hits. As a reliever this season, Shoemaker has been stellar posting a 1-0 record with a 2.84 ERA in seven appearances.

Perfection

Thursday night Frisco closer Jesse Ingram picked up his 21st save of the season. The save marked the 21st time in 21 opportunities Ingram has converted the save. Ingram is the only closer in the Texas league with at least five saves to avoid blowing one.

@San Antonio (7/22) - Got his sixth loss of the season going five innings allowing four runs on eight hits...struck out four for the third time in his last four starts.

San Antonio (7/17) - Made his return from the disabled list, going four innings allowing three runs...struck out just one without walking a batter.

Springfield (6/30) - Got the loss after surrendering four runs in six innings of work...struck out four and walked three.

Doug Mathis has been in a rut over the last two months. Mathis has dropped three of his past four decisions with his last one coming after a two week stint on the disabled list.

Mathis has fared well against Corpus Christi this season going 2-1 with a 3.18 ERA, the lowest among all Frisco starters. Along with leading the team in ERA, Mathis has posted the highest number of walks against the Hooks with nine.

Mathis has gotten off to a rough start in his starts this season surrendering 11 of his 40 runs in the first innings.

TEAM PITCHING: Gave up two Thursday...Saturday had their first shutout since 7/4 against Arkansas...did not allow a home run Thursday, keeping the team total at 98, which is seventh in the Texas League...now posting a team ERA of 4.30, good for fifth place in the Texas League...with 8 strikeouts Thursday Frisco now has 781 K, which is first place in the league....allowed 10 or more runs 11 times...shutout their opponent 9 times, good for first overall... with 8 whiffs Thursday, Frisco pitching has struck out at least 8 in 26 of their last 36 contests.

STARTERS: Armando Galarraga got the no-decision Thursday...went five innings while allowing only one run on six hits...struck out four and walked one...Riders' starters have allowed three runs or less in 18 of their past 24 ballgames...have also allowed only five hits or fewer in 19 of their last 24 contests as well.

RELIEVERS: Two Rider relievers were used Thursday...gave up one runs over the final four innings...7/17 allowed nine runs, tying a season high and their most since 5/1 against San Antonio...bullpen has led the way late in games, as the 'Riders are 51-3 when holding a lead after 7 innings...Jesse Ingram picked up his 21st save on 7/26, striking out two...6/23 against Corpus Christi, Ingram had his most impressive outing of the season, going 2.0 scoreless innings, yielding only two hits and striking out five...Kea Kometani picked up his seventh save of the season Monday, pitching a scoreless ninth to preserve the win...since being moved to the bullpen, Kometani has served as a platoon to Jesse Ingram, picking up 7 saves...the team has 31 saves, tied for the league lead.
